## **Programme Outcome**

The M. A. Programme in Political Science is designed and structured with a view to understand the place of Political Science within the broader spectrum of Social Sciences and allied interdisciplinary areas. The study of the subjects also helps to develop an understanding of the fundamental principles and theories of politics to include foundations of political community, the structure and process of government, citizenship and forms of political participation, and the public policy process. It will also support the learners to gain an understanding and appreciation of current political issues and concerns and their impact upon the contemporary political environment. The study of the subject helps to understand the decisions human beings make in political settings, including those regarding the forms of government available and understand the philosophical underpinnings of political systems, major ideologies, and political parties. Foster an understanding of political methodology and analysis and the ability to construct basic political theories used to explain political and governmental behaviour. Develop the ability to research, analyse, and evaluate political data and information and the ability to use information databases. Finally, the learning of the subject helps the learner for effective and virtuous citizenship.
